I would like to express my opinion mainly on Prof. Josep Stoltman' paper. I think Dr. Stoltman' paper is a high-level article that shows how geographical name can and should contribute to peace, cooperation and justice. I learned a lot. It has helped a lot people here, including myself, work theoretically and practically.

In particular, pointing out that the experience of sharing the waterways and international lakes across the borders of various countrys and the peaceful and cooperative nature of the issues of naming related to various countries will help resolve the Korea-Japan conflict over the *East Sea* and the *Sea of Japan* I think that the people of Korea and Japan should be carved well.

The professor also presented concrete methodology, emphasizing that discussions that are mainly held in the upper echelons and international organizations such as the government should be extended to wide variety of stakeholders, especially ordinary citizens, and discussions should be carried out in a long term and in a good faith. In Korea, about 17 million people were gathered in the square with candles, despite the cold winter day, from the end of October to the end of March last year for 20 weeks. As a result, the authoritarian and corrupt regimes were driven and a new democratic regime was established. This is where the citizens' awareness and continued participation can be seen.

The professor also presented three benefits for each of the two countries, one by one, by solving the problem of naming the *East Sea* and the *Sea of Japan*. In order to resolve the conflicts between the two countries, it should be a good basis for discussion because it should have the benefits that can be gained. However, we believe that the benefits of each of the five products are limited in that they are both abstract and value-oriented. Specifically, I would like to find out what kind of benefits there is in terms of materiality in the comprehensive debate session.
